# Response Sent

- From what age are young people no longer able to access child and adolescent mental health services in your local area?
  We accept referrals up to a person's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- How many adolescents in care (aged 13-18) used any CAMHS service in 2016?More than 60 patients who are looked after accessed our services in 2016
- 3. How many of these adolescents in care (aged 13-18) were referred to CAMHS, in 2016, by:
  - a) care workers
  - b) GPs



- c) school professionals
- d) other/no source of referral?

The referrals are not labelled and collected in this way. Most of the referrals that we receive are from GPs, Education Services, Community Health Services, Local Authority/Social Services and self-referrals amongst others.

Based on the referral source categories we have, and those where 'Yes' is indicated as Looked after Child on the Safeguarding form the numbers referred in 2016 are indicated below:
