Further information on contract annual spend by the Trust is being withheld under Section 43(2) Prejudice to commercial interests. Section 43(2) is a qualified exemption which requires us to carry out the public interest test. We have carried out the public interest test and below are our considerations.



Arguments in favor of disclosure:

• Transparency in how public funds are spent

Arguments in favour of maintaining the exemption:

 The Trust has a duty to achieve value for money, and disclosure could lead to increased costs for the Trust as it could result in the Trust having to pay more for services when negotiating new contracts, for example, suppliers could raise their prices if they know how much the Trust has previously paid.

We have concluded that the public interest test in withholding the information outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

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
