Response sent

The Tavistock and Portman NHS Foundation Trust's Adults' Psychotherapy Service does not make formal diagnoses of BDD, Anorexia nervosa, Schizophrenia, OCD or Body Dysmorphia, though we would work with these conditions as part of an overall mental health presentation.

Where such diagnoses have been made by a patient's previous clinician, prior to referral, they would have been uploaded into the freetext sections of the patients' records, where we would not be able to run any automated reports, and would need to manually extract, collate, and present this data.

We hope you will understand to search for the conditions specified would require a manual search of thousands of files, covering all patients seen over the last 5 years, and this exceed the appropriate limit of resources provisioned under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), for which the appropriate limit is £450, which equates to 18 hours' of officer time at a generic £25 per hour. We estimate that at 15 minutes per record, the time required would be 250 hours per thousand files.

It is with regret therefore that we must advise that we are engaging section 12 exemption, as we cannot process your request due to the excessive resources it would require. We have notated your questions below as such.
