Regarding your Question 8, our response is as follows:

Q: What staff roles within the service hold caseloads, and what is the upper limit of caseload capacity (numbers) for each role?

1. Gender Identity Development Service (GIDS)

(for children and young people under 18 years of age):.

In GIDS we employ 46.5 WTE in clinical staff across the London and Leeds bases. Disciplines consist of Psychiatry, Clinical and Counselling Psychology, Social Work, Psychotherapy and Family Therapy.

There is no prescribed upper limit for any member of staff's caseload. Young people present with varying needs and the input required is managed case by case, often spanning over a number of years. All caseloads are reviewed regularly in line management and supervision meetings to ensure staff member's caseloads are not too high.

2. Gender Identity Clinic (GIC)

for Adults over 18 years of age.

Our 19 clinical staff members consist of Psychiatrists, Counselling Psychologists, Speech and Language Therapists, Endocrinologists and Nurses.

There are over 7000 open cases at the clinic currently, although these patients are seen by a variety of staff depending on need and therefor, not one staff member has a specific caseload
