Slide 17 (attached) says that the youngest age "at hormone blockers" was 10.3 years.

I'd be most grateful if you could explain this discrepancy.

### Response Sent

This presentation pertains to a different cohort to the EI study cohort, as evidenced by the recruitment dates which run later than the EI cohort recruitment dates, and the number of patients in the cohort, which is larger than the 44 in the EI study cohort.

The youngest patient in this group was recruited after the EI study, under 'stage' not 'age' criteria applied by the Early Intervention Clinic pathway.
