 Can you describe the step-by-step process for the aftercare received by trans patients following Hormone Replacement Therapy and/or gender transition surgery?
 For the Gender Identity Clinic (GIC), which sees adults: aftercare is bespoke for the individual patient and is assessed and planned by relevant clinicians. There is no step-bystep process.

For the Gender Identity Development Service (GIDS) which sees young people up to the age of 18: please note that only a minority of the young people referred to our service are prescribed 'hormone replacement therapy'. These are prescribed through our associated endocrine clinics at UCLH and LGI. Aftercare will be bespoke to each patient and will be planned by the relevant clinic. There is therefore no step-by-step process.
